

I. Introduction

Prelude

Kabikankan Mukundaram Mahavidyalaya, Keshabpur, Hooghly, the Arts Degree College is affiliated to the University of Burdwan and was established on 28th May, 2007. College was established by the generous and enthusiastic people, politicians, industrialists and educationists of the local area. It is named to commemorate the birth place (Daminya) of the Poet of the Medieval Era, Kabikankan Mukundaram Chakraborty and its contribution on social-reformation. Now, this College stands as a testament to the commitment to educational accessibility, addressing the needs of the local students and fostering a conducive environment for higher learning. Currently, the college functions from its own campus building constructed on land donated by the generous villagers (constructed on land given on 99 years lease by a local high school, Keshabpur Mahendra Institution). Presently, the College offers 5 UG Honours Programmes and 9 General Programmes. Curriculum and Credit Framework under NEP 2020 has been implemented in the College as per the University norms since 2023.

The College possesses a congenial ambience. During these decades College has developed an infrastructure accommodating different subjects; now it stands as a testament to the commitment to educational accessibility, addressing the needs of the local students and fostering a conducive environment for higher learning. College possesses a green ambience. College provides academic facilities like learning atmosphere.

Now, the College voluntarily has started the academic & administrative audit for the last five years from 2018-'19 to 2022-'23 to look into its strengths and weaknesses and identify the scope of further improvement and is preparing for First Cycle of accreditation by NAAC.

II. Audit Committee

III. Objective & Scope of the Audit

Preliminary meeting was held in presence of Dr Mahamaya Laha Mukherjee, Principal and IQAC Coordinator & other faculty members on 18-05-2024 at 11.30 am. Dr Laha Mukherjee has outlined the broad objectives of the academic audit as an assessment of the College. Accordingly, the audit team members decided to look into the prevailing situation at the College to assess the following aspects in course of the audit.

Scope

- Methodology of teaching and learning adopted for the different courses run by the College
- Functioning of IQAC towards institutionalization and internalization of quality enhancement in the institution
- Functioning of the administrative committees including Finance section
- Examination and Evaluation system
- Activities of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell
- Central Library and the sports facilities
- Outreach Programmes conducted by NSS
- Alumni/ae and their contributions to the College
- · Opportunities and Scope of improvements in the major functional areas

The team is empowered and expected to express their views and give suggestions for the improvement of the systems being followed by the College.

IV. Methodology

At the meeting with Dr Mahamaya Laha Mukherjee, Principal, the Coordinator-IQAC and other faculty members, officials, a discussion was made; Principal gave a general and broad profile of the facilities and activities of the College. The new facilities added are in the process of being developed were also noted by the audit team.

The Audit team visited the various departments and facilities, Office, physical facilities and had brief interactions with the faculty of each department, and the support staffs. Visits to the laboratories, computer facilities, the Library, canteen, gymnasium room and some of the other facilities of the College were accommodated in the schedule arranged by the College to enable the Audit Committee to acquire relevant first-hand information.

Based on the departmental profile, information/data presented by the Head/Coordinator, from the available documents and the interactions with the Head/Coordinator relating to different components of the department/institution, the Audit Committee has made a sincere endeavour to put forward certain views, observations and recommendations in the body of this report with expectations that these recommendations, when implemented, will best serve the interest of the College as intended.



The College comprises the total campus area of 12,829 sq. m with a built-up area of 1,577 sq. m maintaining a green area of 669 sq. m.

2. Distinctiveness of Institutional achievements

- · The College was founded in 2007 and affiliated to the University of Burdwan.
- Since its establishment the College has made some improvement in the field of education in India based on the tenet's commitment, care and service.
- College runs one academic programme, i.e., Arts and one professional course on Physical Education.
- Departments are organizing seminar/ series of lectures/ webinars to motivate the students.
- Some of the faculty members are publishing their research articles in UGC Care listed journals, book chapters having proper ISBN, conference proceedings, etc.
- College has taken initiatives to install SOLAR System-on-grid
- College maintains greenery in and around the campus.
- College intends to maintain Garden, Fruit plants, etc., within the campus and also motivate
 the students in campus cleaning programs and pollution free campus.
- All teaching and non-teaching staff members, and students are aware about cleanliness and hygiene, water conservation, etc.
- College has Rainwater Harvesting System sponsored by Zilla Parishad.
- College provides free Wi-Fi facility.
- Library has a total of 4,639 printed books.
- No new minor or major projects during the year of assessment.
- College has introduced some Add-on courses for creation/generation of job opportunities and become employable.
- Overall pass percentage is satisfactory.
- Most of the teachers are well-experienced; Steachers have been awarded PhD.
- The support staffs are very happy with the College Administration.
- · College has one Two units of NSS and is undertaking community services
- Some of the best practices such as campus cleaning, maintaining tree plantation, and introducing plastic free zone, etc., are followed in the campus.
- All teaching and non-teaching staff members, and students are aware about cleanliness and hygiene, water conservation, etc.
- The IQAC conducts its tasks efficiently.
- There are total 16 Classrooms, one Audio-Visual Room, one Lab for Geography
- Total no. of full-time teachers is 32, including 20 SACT members and there are 8 non-teaching staff members.

3. Critical Observations

Observations based on the documents provided by the college authorities and meeting with the different stakeholders of the College on May 18, 2024 are given below:

- College must be more focussed on setting its Vision and Mission statements and has to make a good linkage of missions for reaching the goals.
- College has to prepare planning and implementation strategies for quality enhancement of the institute through Enterprise Resource Planning.
- ✓ College has to prepare its own 'Ethics & Code of Conduct' for all stakeholders as per University guidelines.
- Departments are requested to be more concerned about their SWOC analysis and preparing future plans.
- ✓ Department should take more initiative to prepare progression of the students in regard to academic as well as employment.
- ✓ More number of teachers will be included in the University administration/academic part.
- ✓ More number of skill development courses be introduced for the benefit of the students and creation of job opportunities.

- * Teachers should take initiative to publish chapters in books, and in edited volumes.
- Senior faculty members will take initiative to incorporate the relevant new topics in the syllabi for the subject enrichment, skill orientation and more job opportunities and development of entrepreneurship amongst the students.
- Placement process, counselling be initiated by the College authority.
- Sports activities be strengthened.

6. Suggestions

However, after detailed paper examinations and physical verification it is noted that, some of the academic practices are required to be followed by the College very seriously in consonance with NAAC criteria. In addition, certain processes could benefit from further review in order to improve their efficiency, fairness and consistency.

- College is required to implement ERP for better functioning.
- 'Ethics & Code of Conduct' for all stakeholders be framed following the University Guidelines.
- Faculty members should take initiatives to prepare the proposals of Research Projects; there are no new minor or major projects during the year of assessment.
- More number of Add-on courses be introduced for generation of employability opportunities.
- Wall Magazines be published on regular basis.
- Composition of the IQAC be followed as per guidelines, and functioning be strengthened for effective management of the institute.
- Proper grooming and Orientation programmes for the new entrants should be organized.
- In some committees representatives of the students and alumni be introduced.

- College has to take care of disposing the wastes in and around the campus through local panchayat.
- College should take some effective measures/strategic plans to attract the students for this Institute
